

Congregational Meeting Set for June 11th to Elect New Officers

Following worship on June 11th, the congregation will meet to elect its officers for the new program year according to the 2023 Bylaws that were passed by the congregation this spring.

In submitting her report of the Nominations Committee Leslie Schultz wrote, "This has been an interesting and unique year for the Nominating Committee as a result of the new FBC bylaws voted on and accepted by the congregation in May, 2023. The list of positions we are responsible for recruiting has changed slightly as reflected below in the chart on page 6.

Also, the responsibility of recruiting committee members for all committees, with the exception of the pastoral relations committee, is now the responsibility of the chair for each committee. The following is a list of the members we have recruited for church council, officers,

committee chairs, and affiliate representatives who will serve during the 2023-2024 church year. The committee chairs will be elected for three-year terms; the others will be elected for one-year terms.

The Nominations Committee would like to express their sincere thanks to all who have volunteered to fill positions and continue the work of doing justice, loving mercy, and walking humbly with our God."

Maronite Catholics

The Maronite church was formed by Syriac Christians who developed their own hierarchy and traditions from the mid-fourth century and later. During the Islamic conquest, Maronites retreated to the mountains in Lebanon. Though cut off from communication with Rome for 500 years before the Crusades, and for long periods afterwards, Maronites regard themselves not as a church that was eventually "unified" with Rome, having previously been Orthodox, but rather as one that was always united theologically and spiritually with Rome, and which "confirmed" that union when contact was reestablished.

There are about 3.36 million Maronite Catholics worldwide, including about 1.5 million in Lebanon and 64,000 in Syria. The largest numbers outside of Lebanon are living in Argentina (720,000), Brazil (493,000), Mexico (156,000) and Australia (150,000).

Many of the ideals of the Maronite life were shaped by monastic traditions and the history of retreating to the mountains under threat. The namesake of the church, St. Maron (sometimes Maroun), was a hermit monk. Churches and holy sites in Lebanon are often located above towns, in hills and mountains. Other saints of the tradition, aside from the biblical saints—were all revered for their extreme monastic asceticism. Non-monastic Maronite priests can be married.

The long linkage to Rome introduced a number of Latin practices like the Rosary, and fostered a strong devotion to the Immaculate Conception. Since Vatican II, and particularly under Pope St. John Paul II, liturgical reforms have looked to recover important Maronite traditions that had been Latinized. The church is led, under the pope, by the Patriarch of Antioch and All the East, who is headquartered in Lebanon.

Lebanon is beautiful and very complex historically, culturally, religiously, and geographically. I got to see the high school in Beirut where I attended 11th grade. For someone who grew up on the other

We also had very meaningful worship experiences in the Maronite Catholic Church in Byblos and the one in their hometown of Andaket, far in the north very close to the Syrian border.

From there we flew to Italy and had 2 amazing days in Assisi. It was so much more than we expected — truly a pilgrimage place of so much beauty and spiritual energy. It's not just about St. Francis and St. Clare; it's about all the loving, spiritual people who have come there for 800 years and continue to come today! Hard to put into words! Bill and I have a dream that we would love to return there with some of you someday! Let me know if you'd like to hear more!

Here at First Baptist, I am grateful for all that has happened this spring! Janice Nigro on board as our new Office Manager, our Bylaws revised, a full slate of leaders ready to be elected for the coming year, a great Women's Retreat, and several "newcomers" in our midst who want to learn more about ways to be involved. 





St. Cecilia Window Removed for Restoration









St Cecilia window removal for restoration: Stain glass restorer carefully removed FBC's St Cecilia window to be restored at their workshop over the coming months. The pieces of glass on the window were so loose that they had to be taped before removing the window. Judy Kennison again secured a grant from the Historic Preservation group to pay for about half the cost of the restoration.

Changes Made with 2023 Bylaws

The 2023 Bylaws passed by the FBC congregation om May 7, 2023 moves the governance of First Baptist from a dual chamber (Cabinet and Trustees) to a one chamber system with one Church Council whose members serve as the Trustees of the church. The new Bylaws state:

"The Church Council serves as the principal visioning and administrative body of the Church. With maximum transparency, the Council initiates plans and makes decisions on all Church business not requiring Congregational approval. In the event of a capital emergency, the Church Council may approve an expenditure beyond 5% of the Annual Budget to protect the Church building and grounds and other physical assets.

The Church Council is composed of twelve (12) Trustees of the Church who are the Moderator, Vice Moderator, Treasurer, Clerk, Chairpersons of the seven (7) Council Committees, and member at large. Each position on the Council has one vote. If a position is shared by two individuals, only one of the two is a Trustee. The Pastor is ex-officio member, without a vote. The Moderator convenes, facilitates, and chairs the Church Council."

Highlights of May 8th Cabinet Meeting

- Treasurer David Caughey reported that the budget surplus at month's end was \$76,070.54, which remains unusually large, even for this time of year, thanks to the many members and friends who already have paid much, of all, of their 2023 Pledges; the total contribution to the ABC-USA Retired Ministers and Missionaries is \$1,079.90; a donation of \$10,000.00 to the Building Fund was made by an anonymous donor to help pay for the additional costs of exterior stone repair approved by the congregation.
- Pastor Debbie reported that she and Bill had a wonderful tip to Lebanon to meet their daughter Anna, their sonin-law Maroun and his parents, and then to visit Assisi, home of St Francis, in Italy.
- There was considerable discussion about the status of replacing the heating system, possibly with heat pump, (see article on bottom right).
- Bequest Allocation: Margie Latham reported that the ad hoc committee continues to make progress on the bequest allocation resolution, but they are not ready to present a proposal.

Heating First Baptist

From the Annual Trustees Report by Bill Fry

The FBC boiler is beyond its expected (guaranteed?) lifetime and the congregation has approved expenditure to replace it.

Early Heat Pump Estimates

The Trustees had previously worked with Cabezas Engineering on a design, but during that process, Mr Cabezas suggested (March 2022) that heat pumps might be affordable (\$150,000 to \$180,000 in a project that could be done in three phases). Heat pumps could also cool the building in the summer. Therefore, the Trustees worked to obtain estimates for heat pumps. Three companies said that they would provide estimates, but only two have done so. However, the first estimate (early December 2022) was over \$200,000 for only the first phase (community room, office, library/lounge, nursery, kitchen, upstairs), so the Trustees concluded

that installing heat pumps was not economically feasible and they again began getting estimates for boiler replacement. Those estimates are still coming in.

NYSEG Incentive Program

In the meantime, discussions with LaMorte Electric (a second company) took an interesting turn because LaMorte Electric was in contact with Bloc Power consulting company who alerted us on 25 April 2023 to an incentive program with NYSEG for installing heat pumps. The incentive will pay about two-thirds of the cost — which brings the cost to within the initial range that Cabezas Engineering suggested. The enrollment period ended on 30 April 2023, so the Trustees had to work quickly. At the time of this writing (16 May 2023) we are still in process.


