A Strategy for Giving From Your IRAs

A popular strategy for reducing your income taxes is donating money from your IRAs annual mandatory distribution (RMD) to an elgible charity such as First Baptist. The IRS allows you to donate up to \$100,000 a year from an IRA without having to pay income tax. The money you withdraw will still count toward your RMD so you don't have to worry about a 50% tax penalty for failing to take distributions. To make this transfer of funds from your IRA to First Baptist, contact your IRA custodian. You're not allowed to claim the donation as a charitable deduction on your taxes. 
